Each morning I try as often as possible to get out to the foyer to welcome students to school and each afternoon say good-bye to the students. Your children are full of love. I feel a big responsibility to watch over them.

Our students put on a wonderful performance for this year's school play, "Cinderella". Our school choir led by Mrs. Romney, our music specialist, practice twice a week before school. Recently they were invited to sing the National Anthem at the Utah Starz game.

You are all aware of the events of that took place at the Florida high school last month. This has caused all schools throughout the United States to reflect on the safety and security of our students and the procedures we have in place to secure our own school.

We currently lock all outside doors all day, except the front main doors. It keeps guests from entering any door other than the front door. Our portables each have two key cards so students can enter the building when needed. Teachers lock their doors all day with a magnet blocking the latch. If we announce a lock out drill, the teachers pull the magnet out and the door is locked. If an employee notices someone in the hall without an employee card or visitors badge, the individual is asked to return to the office for a visitors pass.

The district has plans to build secured vestibules in all the schools that forces everyone through the main office. The district goal is to have this completed in all school in three years. The cost of doing this to all schools quicker is the only deterrent.

Our hearts and prayers go out to the many, many individuals and families hurting because of this tragedy. On that day, consider the thousands of schools in the United States that were safe.
