
As you shop, take time to greet and with the clerks a "Merry Christmas!" You will find it makes their day. Most don't hear it from the customers.

At the end of each term, to encourage the students to read and record their reading minutes in the Road To Success Reading Program, I pass out Free Popcorn Passes to the students that have recorded the MINIMUM amount of reading which is 100 minutes a week (20 minutes of reading a day - 5 days a week.)



Congratulations to the 369 students that met that goal by Week 9 (900 minutes) in November. That is 44% of the students.

I will give out Popcorn Passes again after week 18 which is the end of the 2nd Term in January. Students will need to have recorded at least 1800 minutes.
